

## WHAT WE ARE SEEING

At a glance, Elbon Rye and Triticale look very similar but when you take a closer look, you'll see distinctive differences.



Elbon tends to break winter dormancy one to weeks earlier when compared to the Triticale (or VNS Rye, if you're more familiar with that product).

Elbon's ability to break ahead of other cover crops could provide you with two great options:
